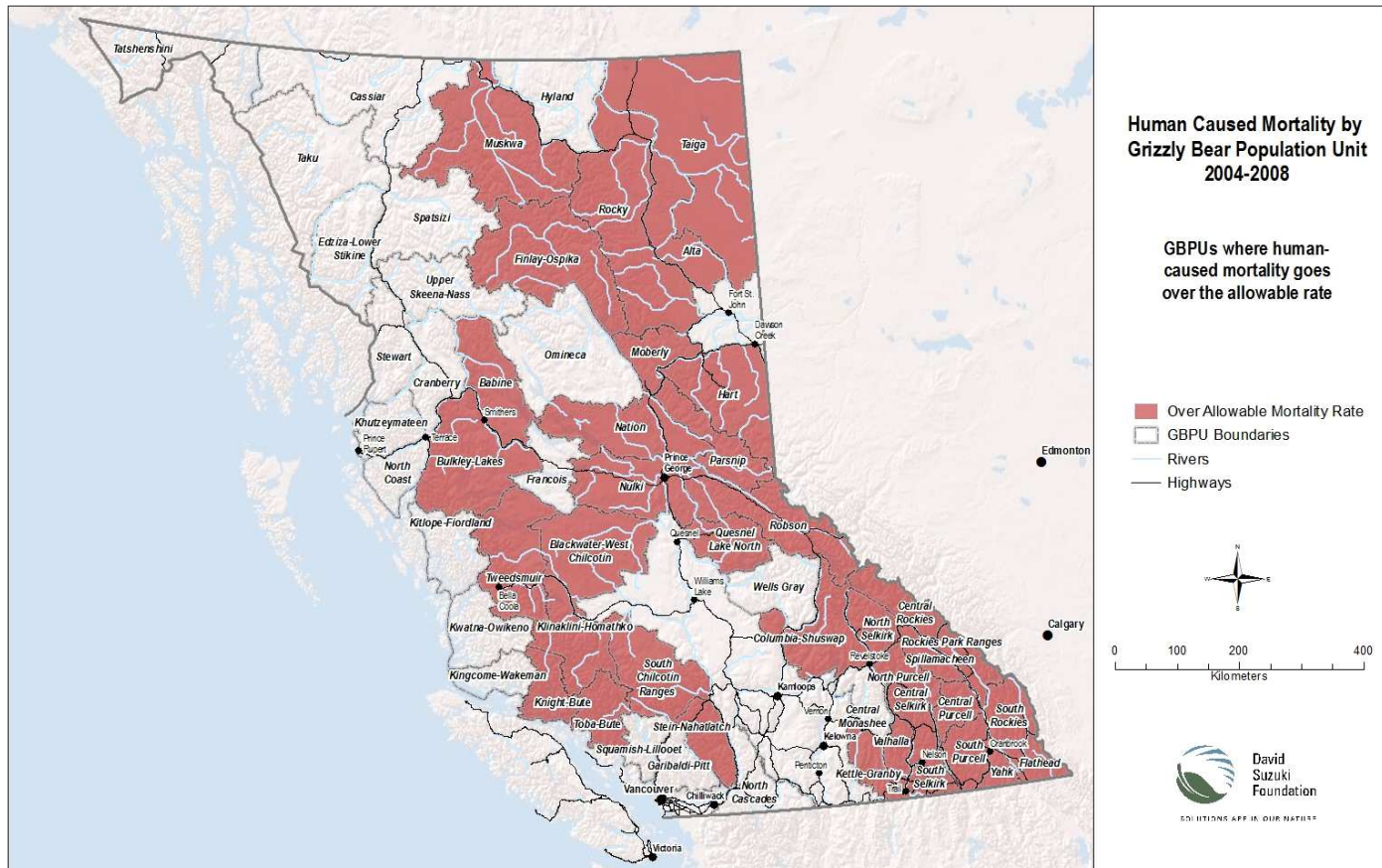
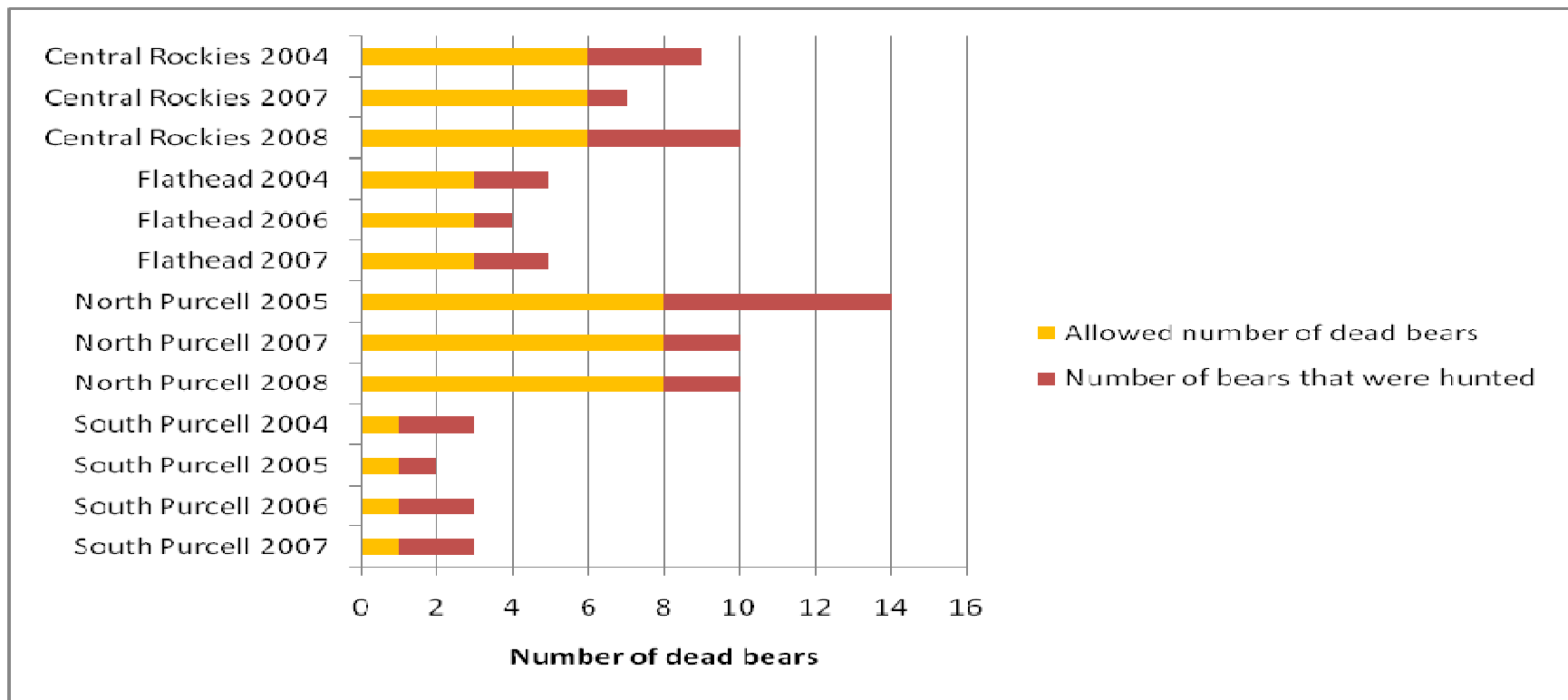


**Figure 1. This graph shows the number of grizzlies that have been killed by trophy hunters in B.C. since the government began tracking mortality statistics in 1977. A total of 9,484 bears have been shot by hunters between 1977 and 2009. A province-wide moratorium on grizzly hunting was instituted in early 2001 by the government of the day but then lifted in that same year after the government was defeated in a provincial election. Fifty-eight grizzlies were killed by hunters during the 2001 fall hunt after the hunt was re-instated by the new government. An average of 253 grizzly bears have been killed by hunters each year since the trophy hunt was reinstated in 2001.**



**Figure 2.** This map shows the Grizzly Bear Population Units (GBPU) where the human-caused mortality of bears (hunting kills and non-hunting kills) exceeded allowable rates in at least one year between 2004 and 2008.
