MAPPING CITIES' CLIMATE RESILIENCE

Instead of traditional grey infrastructure (roads, buildings, sewers, etc.), cities need to incorporate more green spaces, trees and waterways that help regulate temperature, reduce floods and improve air quality. We partnered with environmental solutions platform developer Habitat to review and graph ecosystem services in five pilot cities: Gatineau, Ottawa, Quebec City, Saskatoon and Vancouver. The resulting mapping tool helps decision-makers recognize, prioritize and protect natural systems that have significant — and often overlooked or misunderstood — community benefits.

DEMANDING POLITICIANS PROTECT THE PLANET

All people in Canada benefit when we take care of the environment and each other: cleaner air, better health, resilient communities and more jobs and investment opportunities. Leading up to the April federal election, our community members sent thousands of letters to all party leaders demanding that the next government prioritize climate solutions and nature protection and support strong environmental and social justice values. **We continue to be your eyes and ears on Parliament Hill.**

LANDING CANADA'S CLEAN ELECTRICITY REGULATIONS

Despite opposition from fossil fuel billionaires and politicians who serve their interests, collective action helped achieve Canada's clean electricity regulations. Now it's up to the provinces and utilities to implement plans that go even further, to gain the most benefits for people living in Canada. We must also ensure that workers, communities and Indigenous nations on whose lands these projects are built will benefit directly from this once-in-a-generation opportunity.

REWILDING TO HELP NATURE HEAL

LawnShare helps individuals, companies and communities adopt sustainable lawn-care practices and transform yards, fields and roadsides into healthier environments for wildlife and humans. The Butterflyway Project's volunteer Rangers create neighbourhood native plant gardens to feed and shelter pollinators. Healing Forests bring Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities together, fostering dialogue and honouring residential school victims, survivors and their families. And we're pushing for bylaw reform against outdated policies that limit these kind of rewilding efforts.
